Year Two have been continuing their work on 'Brilliant Braintree' and have visited both the library and the public gardens. I liked reading their 'rules' for the school trip, using commands to ensure that everyone would be safe and remember all that they needed.

Thank you to those of you who shared information about our Open Day which was this Saturday for prospective parents. We had lots of new families visit who all fed back how warm and welcoming the school felt.
