Basildon Skills Show: 17 October

<u>Attend the Basildon Skills Show</u> on 17 October 2023 at the Towngate Theatre, 3.30pm to 7.30pm. Essex County Council (ECC) are working with Basildon Council to support young people to attend this year's Basildon Skills Show.

The last hour of the event, 6.30pm to 7.30pm, is specifically for individuals with SEND. It will include representation from ECC's Preparing for Adulthood, Social Care and Targeted Employment

teams. There will also be 50 employers, education, and training providers.

The return to school can be challenging for many, adjusting to new routines, new schools or returning to old ones. Sometimes the transition is managed well, sometimes it is difficult. There are those whose children, for whatever reason, aren't returning to school and that can be tough.

Suspensions, permanent exclusions and children out of education training: 12 and 13 September

This session has been designed for parent and carers who want to know more about exclusion and children out of education for other reasons. It will cover law and the rights of parents and carers of children who are out of education due to exclusions, suspensions or illness. There will be a Q&A session during and at the end of the training.

This training is being delivered by SEND IASS and SENETA on Tuesday 12 September, 9.30am to 12.30pm, and Wednesday 13 September, 6.30pm to 9.30pm.

Tell us about what you do:

We give young people information, advice, and guidance about their options. We ensure they have the information they need to make decisions about their future. The support and information given is personal to each young person. It is based on each young person's interests, strengths and hopes for the future.

We work with young people aged 14 -25 who have an <u>Education</u> <u>Health and Care Plan (EHCP)</u> or receive Higher Needs Funding to attend Further Education.

What would you like families and young people to know?

PfA Advisors are all qualified Careers Guidance Professionals. They support young people to think about the four Preparing for Adulthood pathways and identify their hopes for the future. These pathways are:

• employment

- education and training
- good health
- community inclusion
- independent living

Young people are supported to think about the future and explore what they might like to do as a job. We also look at what employability and life skills they could develop to build their independence.

What do you enjoy most about your job?
